2024 3 WAYS TO VOLUNTEER REMOTE OR IN-PERSON

Remote Interviews

Work with a panel of judges to interview teams via scripted interview questions, evaluate teams using a rubric, and nominate them for follow up in-person interviews. Judging is done in 3 hour increments using Zoom, with approximately 6 teams interviewed during that time. Remote Interviews begin in late February and run through early April 2024.

Remote Engineering Notebook

Using a rubric, remotely evaluate Digital Engineering Notebooks submitted by teams. Engineering Notebook evaluations are typically self-paced, and depending on the notebook it takes 15-20 minutes on average to read through and score each submission. Engineering Notebook Evaluations take place in late February and run through early April 2024.

In-Person Interviews

Interview teams as a part of a judging panel, and evaluate responses using a rubric. Deliberate and decide upon award winners. This process builds upon the work done by remote judges. In-person judges must be able to attend the 2024 VEX Robotics World Championship, held April 25 - May 3 at the Kay Bailey Hutchison Convention Center in Dallas, Texas.
